Monday 14 March	<p>Defining Quality</p> <p>Our conversation began with an analysis of what defines quality across the UK's diverse higher education landscape by QAA's CEO Vicki Stott, which was published by on the Higher Education Policy Institute (HEPI) website.</p>

Sue is joined by Professor Ruth Whittaker, Pro-Vice-Chancellor (Education and Students) at the University of Brighton, who is currently leading the review of the Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework, and Professor Clare Milsom, Interim Academic Registrar and Chief Operating Officer at Liverpool John Moores University, who was a member of the Credit Framework for England Advisory Group. <p>Tuesday 3 May</p>	<p>Reassessing assessment: Getting our approach to assessment right</p> <p>In an era of change, we recognise the urgency for higher education providers to review their assessment strategy to ensure it is supporting student success, sustainable and securing the academic standards of awards.</p> <p>In the first live debate of QAA at 25, we brought together a panel of experts to consider how the design and delivery of assessment enhances students' experience of the quality of their higher education.</p> <p>Our panel was chaired by Nic Beech, Vice-Chancellor, Middlesex University and comprised Professor Mariann Rand-Weaver, Vice-Provost for Education, Brunel University; Professor Sally Brown, Professor Emerita of HE Diversity in Teaching & Learning, Leeds Beckett University; Professor Clare Peddie, Vice-Principal Education (Proctor), University of St Andrews; and Jonny Barnes, Quality Officer, Solent University and QAA Student Strategic Advisory Committee (SSAC) Member.</p> <p>The event recording is available on our YouTube channel.</p>
<p>Wednesday 11 and Thursday 12 May</p>	<p>QAA Annual Conference: The Quality Continuum</p> <p>Our annual conference facilitated conversations across the quality continuum, reflecting the many different perspectives of quality and standards in higher education.</p> <p>Professor Graham Virgo, Senior Pro Vice-Chancellor for Education at Cambridge University delivered a keynote on 'Defending Quality', which responded to some of the points made by Vicki in her original article.</p>

July	<p>Embedding Education for Sustainable Development</p> <p>Rehema White, Senior Lecturer, School of Geography and Sustainable Development, University of St Andrews wrote a blog discussing ways to assess and strengthen Education for Sustainable Development in the UK and beyond.</p>
August	<p>Does size really matter for a high-quality higher education experience?</p> <p>As the summer progresses, we will explore, through a series of blogs, what's special about the quality in specialist providers in higher education and whether it is difficult for them to meet mainstream expectations.</p>
Wednesday 17 August	<p>Levelling up through access - how do we close the participation gap?</p> <p>This year also marks 25 years of QAA's role as regulator of the Access to HE Diploma. The Diploma transforms lives, each year giving over 24,000 students a second chance and the opportunity to enter higher education.</p> <p>In this month, which sees Access to HE students celebrate their success and progress into higher education, we brought together an expert panel to explore current perspectives on access and participation, including the future role the Access to HE Diploma will play in widening participation in higher education and the positive impact of closing the participation gap.</p> <p>The panel recording is available on our YouTube channel.</p>
Tuesday 27 September	<p>What is quality - perspectives from around the world</p> <p>Higher education is a global concept with international partnership and collaboration proving central to the success of UK and international higher education institutions.</p> <p>In this live online debate, we will unpack what quality means from the perspective of global higher education communities with an expert panel of speakers representing networks of quality agencies based around the world.</p> <p>Our first live conversation of the autumn term will be a roundtable discussion with speakers from around the world.</p>

<p>Wednesday 19 October</p>	<p>At the frontline of protecting academic integrity, what can be done at an institutional level?</p> <p>The recent criminalisation of essay mills in England was an important step towards protecting academic integrity in higher education. However, it is only one part of a multi-faceted solution.</p> <p>In this live debate/conversation on the International Day of Action against Contract Cheating, our panel will consider what can be done at institutional level to promote academic integrity and combat academic misconduct. Speakers will include Helen Gniel, Director, Higher Education Integrity Unit, TEQSA and Professor Michael Draper, Professor of Law, Swansea University (institutional perspective), as well as student representatives from the UK and Ireland.</p> <p>This event is jointly hosted by Quality and Qualifications Ireland (QQI) and QAA reflecting our respective 10th and 25th anniversaries this year.</p>
<p>Thursday 17 November</p>	<p>Regulators and regulation</p> <p>Speaker: Professor Julia Black, Strategic Director of Innovation and Professor of Law at the London School of Economics and Political Science.</p>
