




International Quality Assurance Programme

The International Quality Assurance Programme (IQAP) is a five-day training course that provides excellent opportunities to learn about current issues in higher education quality assurance and build relationships with quality assurance professionals from around the world.

IQAP provides you with opportunities to:

- find out about current issues in higher education quality assurance
- learn from other colleagues from around the world working in similar roles
- · reflect on your role and practices
- develop new skills related to the improvement of quality assurance processes and practice, and identify areas of further development.

Chris McIntyre - Programme Co-leader

Chris McIntyre has a deep understanding of the international context of higher education having worked as a senior manager in UK universities on strategic approaches to management and delivery, and as a consultant on international work to institutions and agencies. He has undertaken academic quality enhancement activities including Academic Board and Academic Development Committee membership, quality management roles, programme design and partnership development. Chris has worked on international projects for more than 10 UK degree-awarding bodies.

Chris has extensive experience of designing, delivering and managing international collaborations in Europe, China, Russia, Singapore and Malaysia. He has significant experience as chair and panel member during institutional approval and validation events in those countries, in addition to working with providers in Sri Lanka, South Africa and Hong Kong. In addition to his work for QAA, Chris has worked as an independent consultant for the quality assurance agency in the Sultanate of Oman on the design, development and implementation of an institutional standards method.

lan Welch accumulated over 30 years of academic and senior managerial experience within the arts education sector before joining QAA.

At QAA, Ian has led on many initiatives at the forefront of UK higher education quality assurance developments, including the Teaching Excellence Framework and a range of QAA review methods. Internationally, Ian has delivered workshops across the Middle East, Europe, South America and Africa. He has led reviews in Albania, Nigeria and Macao and collaborated on the redevelopment of the Pakistan Higher Education Framework and review methodology. Special session: Quality Assurance in the Age of Artificial Intelligence

Eve Alcock - Director of Public Affairs, QAA

Eve Alcock is Director of Public Affairs at QAA, overseeing policy, stakeholder engagement and communications work. Eve is currently leading QAA's work on artificial intelligence in higher education and has spoken at both UK and international higher education events on this topic.

Eve is a Fellow on Aspen UK's Rising Leader fellowship programme. Prior to QAA, she spent two years at the Clean Air Fund, an international charitable foundation tackling air pollution globally, where she worked closely with stakeholders like the World Economic Forum, the World Health Organisation and the United Nations in communications, advocacy and strategic partnerships.

Eve's background in the higher education sector includes two years as President of the University of Bath's Students' Union (SU) where she was also a governor of the University and Chair of the SU's Board of Trustees.



Visit internationally-focused universities

Delegates will visit two UK universities to develop knowledge of quality improvement practice within the higher education sector. **Regent's University London** is part of Galileo Global Education, Europe's largest higher education provider, with a network of 42 institutions over 80 campuses across 13 countries around the world. The **University of London** has more than 40,000 students studying across more than 190 countries, with over 120 Recognised Teaching Centres around the world.

Caroline Carter - Independent Member of the Board of Directors and Trustee, QAA

Caroline Carter is an independent Board member of QAA. She has a portfolio of non-executive director, trustee and governor roles in higher education, access and schools. She is currently an independent member of the Council at Cranfield University (the UK's only postgraduate institution), an advisor to AccessEd, a governor at Copthall School in north London and until recently, a Board member and trustee of The Brilliant Club. Caroline has also been an executive dean of a postgraduate law school at the University of Law in London. These roles followed her lengthy and extensive career as a senior equity partner at Ashurst LLP, a global law firm, where she held several leadership roles.

Caroline read English at the University of London and completed her postgraduate legal qualifications at the College of Law (now the University of Law) in London.



Eduardo Ramos - Director of International & Professional Services, QAA

Eduardo Ramos is responsible for QAA's international services, including international membership, accreditation, consultancy and QE-TNE (quality evaluation and enhancement of UK transnational education). He leads on international partnership building, ensuring QAA continues to work with governments, agencies and institutions globally to benefit UK higher education and its international reputation.

Prior to this, Eduardo worked on education internationalisation for Spanish agency ICEX-Invest in Spain; Audencia Business School in France; St George's, University of London; and Universities UK International. He holds degrees from the Autonomous University of Madrid and the UCL Institute of Education.



Christopher Bland - Head of Accreditation and Consultancy, QAA

Chris Bland focuses on QAA's international accreditation and bespoke projects. He has substantial international experience in quality assurance, course design and strategic development.

He is a Fellow of the Royal Aeronautical Society. As well as being on the committee of the local branch, he sits on the society's membership and accreditation committees. He has been the Chair of many approval events considering the professional accreditation of aerospace courses at apprenticeship, undergraduate and postgraduate levels.

He has been the Group Director of Quality Assurance at Coventry University. There he was responsible for the quality assurance activities and course approval processes across the university group and for courses taught at over 40 collaborative partners across the world.

Prior to joining the QAA he was the Registrar at The Knowledge Hub Universities in Cairo, Egypt; and for nine years, he was a Head of Department leading computing and aerospace subjects. Managing a department of 85 people, degree courses were offered in computer science, software development and games technologies as well as systems engineering and aerospace technology.
