## DEFINITIONS (ACADEMIC CITATIONS)

Clearly define key terms and concepts using credible academic sources (e.g., peer-reviewed journals, textbooks).



## STATISTICS (EMPIRICAL DATA)

Use quantitative data from reliable sources (government reports, official statistics, academic studies).

Explain what the numbers mean and how they support your argument.



## THEORIES

Identify and explain relevant theoretical frameworks

Discuss how these theories apply to your topic and provide critical analysis.

Compare multiple theories, highlighting strengths and weaknesses.



## LEGISLATION

Reference specific laws, acts, or policies relevant to your topic.

Explain their purpose, scope, and implications for practice.

Consider policies, the approach in real world situations



## COMPARE AND CONTRAST

Compare and contrast different approaches, policies, or interventions.

Discuss positives and negatives (effectiveness, ethical considerations, unintended consequences).

Evaluate and provide recommendations based on evidence and analysis.



## IMPACT

Evidence of the impact

Include financial impact (costings, societal and state).

Discuss whether interventions are economically sustainable.



## LINK TO REAL WORLD (CASE STUDIES)

Use real-world examples or case studies to illustrate theory in practice.

Explain the impact on society, including offenders, victims, and the CJS.

Answer the “So what?” question. Why does this matter?
